

TA TIPS AND Tricks

Adapting Play Activities to Meet Infant/Toddler Needs

You may be a parent, relative, or caregiver of a child that has special needs. A physical, mental, or social disability can pose the occasional challenge to play time. Still, all children learn through play and any play activity can be adapted to meet a child's unique needs. The guidelines below can help you think about how to make playtime enjoyable and appropriate to your child's skills, preferences, and abilities:

Think about the environment. How do variables like sound or light affect your child? What is the background noise like in your play area? Is there a television or radio on? Are there many other kids around? If your child seems distressed during playtime, and you've tried everything else, move to a quieter, less stimulating area to play.

How does your child respond to new things? Some infants and toddlers, particularly if they have a special need, are easily over-stimulated, while others enjoy a lot of activity. Try starting playtime slowly, with one toy or object, and gradually add others. See what kind of reactions you get. Are there smiles when a stuffed bear is touched and hugged? Does your child seem startled by the loud noises coming from the toy fire engine?

How does your child react to different textures, smells, and tastes? For example, some objects may be particularly enjoyable for your little one to touch and hold. Others may "feel funny" to them. Read your child's signals and modify the play experience accordingly.

Involve peers. It is important for a child with special needs, just as it is for a child who is typically developing, to establish relationships with peers. Arrange playdates or look for opportunities for your child to play with other children, such as at the park or during a library story hour. Having fun with peers is an important way that children learn social skills like sharing, conflict resolution, and empathy—and also help prepare children for the school setting later on.

What is EXCELS?

Maryland EXCELS promotes quality by awarding ratings to Child Care Centers, School-Age Child Care Programs, Family Child Care Homes and Public Prekindergarten programs. These ratings are available to families as a way to help them make informed choices in the care of their children.

The system is simple: programs earn ratings on five progressive check levels that form a pathway to excellence. A rating of '1' is awarded to providers and programs that successfully meet initial requirements, while a rating of '5' is awarded to those that have achieved the highest level of quality.

The Maryland EXCELS framework is based on five core disciplines:

- 1. Compliance
- 2. Professional Development
- 3. Accreditation
- 4. Developmentally Appropriate Activities
- 5. Administrative Practices

Each of these disciplines represents a critical building block to achieving quality in early child-hood and school-age programs. Financial incentives and technical assistance are available to programs electing to participate in Maryland EXCELS, and any licensed child care or public pre-kindergarten program is eligible to apply. Parents and community members are given easy access to a listing of providers in their area through the Maryland EXCELS website and mobile app.

Benefits

All programs participating in Maryland EXCELS at every level demonstrate a commitment to quality improvement. As an added benefit and a way of supporting the effort to improve quality, Maryland EXCELS programs have access to a variety of resources, such as:

- Increased Child Care Subsidy reimbursements
- Discounts from various vendors and organizations
- Professional Activity Units (PAUs) for specified activities
- Marketing and advertising opportunities
- Targeted technical assistance, both online and face-to-face from Program Coordinators, Quality Assurance Specialists, and local Child Care Resource Centers
- Professional Development
- Additional Achievement Badges
- Free Training



Office of Child Care Training Requirements

Family Child Care - New Applicant (1/1/2016)

- Pre-Service 24 Hour Training (six 4-hour modules)
- 6-hour class in Emergency and Disaster Preparedness
- 6-hour Medication Administration
- 3-hours Including All Children and the ADA
- Infant/Child/Adult CPR and First Aid Certifications
- SIDS: Sudden Infant Death Syndrome and Supporting Breastfeeding in Child Care Family Child Care
- Basic Health & Safety

First Renewal Year (applied for license prior to 2016)

- 3-hours of training in each of four areas: Child Development, Mixed Age Groups, Health/Safety/ Nutrition, and Professionalism
- Current First Aid and CPR certifications
- 6-additional hours of approved training in any area
- Applicants prior to Jan. 1, 2016, may need other specific training if not taken before registered.
- Verify requirements with your licensing specialist prior to workshop registration.

Family Child Care - After First Renewal

- 6 hours of approved Core of Knowledge training
- 6 additional hours of approved training in any area
- Current First Aid and CPR certifications

Child Care Center Staff

For current staff staying in the same positions:

- Aide/Assistant 6 hours per year
- Child Care Teacher 12 hours per year
- Child Care Director 12 hours per year

New hires and staff moving to new positions are subject to additional requirements which may include:

- 9-hour Communication Course
